




A message from lan







The event Chris is preparing for in March is called the **Beast of the Blacks**. The route, which is at an altitude of 9,000 feet, is famously used by the British Army to train their Paratrooper Officers. For the event, Chris must carry her entire kit, including poles, on her back. She has expressed significant apprehension, describing the challenge ahead as intimidating. However, all the training will get her through and the benefit for wellbeing is priceless!
